Short Stories

Up to 5,000 words: £75 Turnaround 2–3 weeks. 1–2 page report (single spaced) Submit via email

Novels/Non-Fiction Manuscripts

60-90,000 words: £450 Extra pages £1 per page Turnaround 6 weeks. 3–5 page report (single-spaced)

Tutorials

Send in up to 5,000 words ahead of a 1 hour face-to-face or Skype tutorial. £50 per session

Mentor Service

Book four or more tutorial sessions. $\pounds 45$ per hour Longer mentor packages can be arranged, fiction or non-fiction, according to requirements.

Novel in A Year

Eight 1 hour sessions over a year: \pounds 800 Session 1: Synopsis/plot outline/ visualise the book/project – establish a working schedule Sessions 2–7: Email in 15,000 words ahead of 1 hour tutorial Session 3: Overview; next steps Optional extra: tutor will read whole manuscript between sessions 7 + 8 at reduced cost of £350
